Worship Ministry General Information

General Requirements for Volunteers

It is our privilege to join with you in ministry and we are grateful for your participation in JSCC's Worship. As a member of the Worship community, you are required to read this guide. In addition, you must:

- Be a devoted follower of Christ and treat others in a Christ-like way.
- Conduct yourself according to Biblical principles and the values of our church.
- Maintain a Godly attitude toward ministry leadership.
- Regularly attend services at JSCC regardless of whether or not you are scheduled to serve.
- Read and respond promptly to all general and service-related emails from Worship leadership.
- Respond promptly to all Planning Center invitations and block-out unavailable dates quickly.
- Attend and be on time to all rehearsals in preparation for worship services.
- Prepare spiritually for worship services in advance through prayer and Bible study.

Trusting the Leadership

Serving in the Worship Ministry is a high calling and a great opportunity. As your leaders, it's our responsibility to help discern where you fit best within this ministry and we take this responsibility very seriously. Our ministry to you best happens when we can also help you grow in your relationship with God. Auditions, rehearsals, worshipping together, and engaging in community with you are several ways that we bring this process to fruition for His glory!

Spiritual Integrity Agreement

(For all Volunteers in all Ministries)

As Christians, we aspire to live in a way that our life, language, and choices reflect our submission and loyalty to Jesus Christ. We in the Worship Ministry seek to bring Him honor and strive to be above reproach in every way. In addition to avoiding sinful behavior, we also take into consideration the appearance of sin. Even though some actions may not be sinful in fact, they may weaken the faith of others and inhibit the ability of the individual and the church to proclaim the Gospel.

The following list provides a few examples of the types of behavior that may prevent an individual from serving in the Worship Ministry:

- Substance abuse, including drunkenness or illegal drug use.
- Spending the night with a boyfriend/girlfriend (even if sleeping separately).
- Sexual immorality, including adultery, pre-marital sex, and impurity in dating/marriage relationships. JSCC believes that biblical marriage is between one man and one woman and any sexual acts outside of that marriage are sinful.
- Inappropriate or unbecoming posts and/or photos on social media i.e. Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Snap Chat, etc.

Planning Center Online (PCO)

After your audition, you will be added to our online service-planning app called Planning Center Online (PCO) and then be sent invitations to serve in our various services and Worship Ministry opportunities. You have the option of accepting or declining anything you've been invited to. Please do this promptly as your timely responses help us better manage our service needs.

Entering Blockout Dates in PCO

You are encouraged to block out dates for which you are unavailable or which you do not wish to be booked. This can be done easily in PCO. Please take advantage of this wonderful feature! Job responsibilities, time with your family, and vacations are important and we want to respect your time and encourage you to plan as much in advance as possible when doing so. Under the "My Calendar" section located in the left hand column of your account page, click on "Block out Dates" and block out any and all dates for which you do not want to be booked. You can also block out recurring dates by using the "Repeat" feature.

Dress Code

This dress code applies to all areas of the JSCC Worship Ministry. It is designed to keep us and the congregation focused on the Lord. When we're on stage, we want to avoid any type of clothing that draws too much attention or **could create distraction**. Please view our clothing quidelines listed below:

What Not to Wear:

- shirts with large graphics or designs
- shorts
- clothing that is tight, revealing, or has low necklines (applies to men as well as women)
- sleeveless shirts or blouses
- bright colors
- clothing that sparkles, shines, has sequins, or beading

Hemlines:

For Ladies: When wearing dresses or skirts, please make sure that your hemlines fall below the knee <u>when seated</u>. On an elevated stage, what looks fine in the mirror at home will appear even shorter from the first few rows of the Auditorium/Sanctuary.

Additional Service Information

Backstage Etiquette:

When we are backstage or in an off-stage waiting area, please remember to do the following:

- Give the leadership your full attention during rehearsals, sound checks, and services.
- Refrain from talking backstage during services. Anything you say may be picked up by a microphone.
- Engage your facial expressions when singing or standing on stage. You are leading worship!
- Always thank our crews and tech team.

Photo/Video Disclaimer:

All participants in JSCC services and ministry events may be photographed and/or recorded. These images and videos will be shared openly on social media, the church website, and other media outlets.

What We Believe

JOSHUA SPRINGS CALVARY CHAPEL HAS BEEN FORMED AS A FELLOWSHIP OF BELIEVERS IN THE LORDSHIP OF JESUS CHRIST. OUR SUPREME DESIRE IS TO KNOW CHRIST AND TO BE CONFORMED INTO HIS IMAGE BY THE POWER OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. WE ARE NOT A DENOMINATIONAL CHURCH, NOR ARE WE OPPOSED TO DENOMINATIONS AS SUCH, ONLY THEIR OVEREMPHASIS OF THE DOCTRINAL DIFFERENCES THAT HAVE LED TO THE DIVISION OF THE BODY OF CHRIST.

- We believe that the only true basis of Calvary Chapel is Christ's (Agape) love, which is greater than any differences we possess and without which we have no right to claim ourselves Christians.
- We believe worship of God should be spiritual.
 Therefore: We remain flexible and yielded to the leading of the Holy Spirit to direct our worship.
- We believe worship of God should be inspirational.
 Therefore: We give a great place to music in our worship.
- We believe worship of God should be intelligent.
 Therefore: Our services are designed with great emphasis upon teaching the Word of God that He might instruct us how He should be worshiped.
- We believe worship of God should be fruitful.
 Therefore: We look for His love in our lives as the supreme manifestation that we have truly been worshiping Him.
- We believe in all the fundamental doctrines of evangelical Christianity.
 Therefore: We hold to the inherency of Scripture. The Bible is the inspired, infallible Word of God. The Father, Son and Holy Spirit are one God, eternally existent in three separate persons. Jesus is fully God and fully man. He was born of the virgin, lived a sinless life, provided for the atonement of our sins by His vicarious death on the cross, was bodily resurrected by the power of the Holy Spirit, ascended back to the right hand of God the Father and ever lives to make intercession for us.

After Jesus ascended to Heaven, He poured out His Holy Spirit on the believers in Jerusalem, enabling them to fulfill His command to preach His gospel to the entire world, an obligation shared by all believers today. All people are by nature separated from God and responsible for their own sin. But salvation, redemption and forgiveness are freely offered to all by the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. When a person repents of sin and accepts Jesus Christ as personal Lord and Savior, trusting Him to save, that person is immediately born again and sealed by the Holy Spirit. All sins are forgiven, and that person becomes a child of God.

We hold to all the gifts of the Holy Spirit mentioned in Christ's love. Church governments simplistic rather than a complex bureaucracy. We depend upon the Holy Spirit to lead, rather than fleshly promotion. We await the pre-tribulation return of Christ for His waiting Church. The second coming of Christ with his Saints to rule on the earth will be personal and visible. This motivates us to holy living, committed service, heartfelt worship, the diligent study of God's Word, regular fellowship and participation in baptism and communion.

We hold to the teaching of the Word of God in such a way that it can be applied to life as beneficial towards a growing maturity.
